The origin of the town's "ALUBIJID" could be traced during the pre-Spanish time when what is now Barangay Baybay had been dotted by big trees named Alubijid, legend had it that some of these trees had marks

particularly the huge ones that had grown near the "BUKANA" of a river and a "LOOC" which had been the landing site of different traders from other islands of the archipelago. From these trades, the place where they used to land had been call "ALUBIJID".

It is bounded on the North by Macajalar Bay; on the East by the Municipality of El Salvador; on the South by the Municipality of Manticao; and on the West by the Municipalities of Laguindingan, Gitagum, Libertad, Initao and Naawan. The Municipality is situated in the western part of Misamis Oriental, 25 kilometers west of Cagayan de Oro City and 67 kilometers east of Iligan City.

Alubijid is predominantly an agricultural municipality with 4,812 has. or 42 percent of

its total land area planted to various crops. Slightly over half of the total agricultural area (2,643 has. or 55 percent) is devoted to coconut. Ranking second is a total of 754 hectares or 15.66 percent devoted to cereal production with 634 hectares or 13 percent and 120 hectares or 2.49 percent planted with corn and rice respectively. In most instances, coconut plantations are intercropped with corn, tobacco and root crops. The rest of the land which comprises 1, 415 has. or 29 percent is devoted to various commercial crops.

With efforts to increase agricultural productivity three irrigation facilities serving 120 hectares of rice fields were rehabilitated and improved in. Post harvest facilities e.g. multi purpose drying pavement, rice threshers, corn sheller, warehouse are provided scattered in various locations. Although its numbers are not sufficient to meet the post harvest needs of the farmers.

Loan and credit facility are likewise available for those qualified and good standing farmers. Enhancing the services of the government sector is participation of the local investors in farm tractors, cassava chippers and rice and corn mills.
